We are blessed by God to have you twinned with St. Joseph parish. Although we cannot see one another face-to-face, we can feel the love of God in everything that you do for us. We want you to know that we are

grateful for the improvements that your projects have made in our lives and the positive impact that is visible across our ten chapels.

Medical

We welcomed your medical mission team for the fifth time in 2019. They were kind enough to travel to three chapels and they **treated approximately 769 patients.** It is wonderful to have this service come right to our chapels because it's a difficult trip to the clinic. Since the service is free, that is an added benefit!

Through your donations we were able to **hire a part-time nurse** to follow-up with hypertensive patients. We are so happy that she will re-supply medications and be able to provide any changes in medications that Dr. Georges Baptiste recommends.

Clean Water

Thanks to you, we are beginning the construction of a **cistern at Sacred Heart** chapel and school.

World Water Relief has maintained the water systems they installed at St. Joseph rectory and church and St. Matthias chapel.

We could not afford clean water without your help. Thank you.

The students at Sacred Heart and St. Anthony schools are really happy about the clean drinking water they get from the new **Life Straw Water Systems.**



You are so good to us! We have received all fifty boxes that you have sent this year. We are also grateful to the Parish Twinning Program of the Americas who support the shipment of the sea containers to the twin parishes in Haiti from their twin parish in the United States.

The first boxes unpacked were those containing the **musical instruments.** The Summer Music Camp began the middle of July. So, the intstruments arrived just in time.

We can't thank you enough for all the help you give this community for education. Your support provides the **operating funds** for three schools.

You also enable **30 secondary students** to attend the local Catholic high school.

Since Father Islaire became pastor of St. Jospeh, all of his teachers receive regular instruction in classroom management, teaching strategies and the French language. Everyone in Haiti speaks Haitian Creole. However, all of the national exams are written in French. Therefore, we all study French in school.

Finally, a new pilot program to increase attendance was put in place at Sacred Heart school in 2019. We hope that the enrollment data is good so that we can have the **Food for Attendance** program again next year.
